Expanded catch-and-release season greet trout anglers

Streams also upgraded and reclassified

MADISON - Trout anglers have much to celebrate in 2016, as an expanded early trout season get underway and ongoing habitat improvements are contributing to upgraded stream classifications.

The expanded early catch and release trout season started on January 2 and runs until May 6 on many inland state rivers and streams. The regular trout season opens Saturday, May 7, 2016.

A 2015-2016 fishing license and trout stamp are required to fish during the January 2-March 31,2016 period. A new 2016-2017 fishing license and trout stamp will be required on and after April 1, 2016. Access DNR's online licensing system by searching for "licenses, permits and registrations."

Meanwhile, based on surveys of some 300 waterways over the past two years, Wisconsin DNR fisheries biologists are upgrading the classifications of 14 streams and newly classifying another 27 that for the first time have been documented as sustaining trout populations. Six of the newly classified streams have earned the coveted Class 1 designation.

"Shared efforts by property owners, angling groups such as Trout Unlimited and DNR are contributing to very real improvements in Wisconsin trout streams," said DNR Secretary Cathy Stepp. "At the same time, we believe the expanded early trout season and simplified regular season rules will create even more opportunities for anglers from Wisconsin and beyond to enjoy these world-class waters. We're pleased these initiatives are working hand-in-hand to benefit the environment and the economy."

Joanna Griffin, DNR trout specialist, said the stream survey and classification work helps DNR prioritize streams for improvement and qualify projects for funding from trout stamp sales. "The classification process also provides a way to engage local community members and angling groups with efforts to reduce runoff and adopt best management practices for entire watersheds," Griffin said.



Jacks' Flies of the month...

Mar 1st: Copper Zebra Midge: This is a go to midge pattern. Midges are great patterns to use year round. As we will see, this pattern has more accessories than your standard midge pattern. Midge patterns are usually quite simple, partly because working with tiny hooks (sizes 18-32) can be tough, especially for the sausage-fingered among us. So at first glance, the Copper Zebra Midge looks like a nightmare because it has many features —trailing shuck, wing buds, wrapped thorax, etc. We will work on small tying techniques.

• Mar. 8th; Ice Cream Cone: This fly represents a deep lying chironomid pupa. The fly sinks to depth readily. The white bead in front is the flys hotspot and triggers subsequent strikes (white gills).

- Mar. 15th; Still Form Midge: Founder of fly: Roger Hill. A deadly fly derivative of the Griffith Gnat. This fly is tied on a Daiichi 1140, 20 degree shank, up eye off set hook. Red thread is used to match the head of this fly because of the color of the gnats in Roger Hills streams.
- <u>Mar. 22nd</u>; <u>Turks' Tarantula</u>: Developed by Guy Turk in 1990. This fly has become one of the most popular attractor flies in the world. Why? Because it has a wide profile, great positive buoyancy and high visability. The fly can act as a dry fly, wet fly, or streamer and has great versatility for many species of fish.
- Mar. 29th; Trout MRE: Fly founder: Richard Ross. Uses Daiichi 1160 "Klinkhammer" Hook, the ideal emerger hook. The white parachute with hackle make this fly "dinner on the table", for trout.

After hatchery by Altura closes, two Wisconsin facilities to stock trout in Minnesota

Disease closed hatchery by Altura; it won't be viable for at least three years.

A pair of federal fish hatcheries in Wisconsin will help Minnesota with trout stocking for the next three years while the Department of Natural Resources re-establishes a hatchery near Altura, Minn., that was devastated by a persistent outbreak of desease

The Crystal Springs hatchery in southeastern Minnesota was shut down last week with the removal and incineration of all 18,465 pounds of brook trout and lake trout in its tanks. The fish were exposed to a pathogen that causes furunculosis, a desease that forms boils and lesions on fish and eventually kills them.

It was detected in 2014 and spread throughout the hatchery despite numberous attempts to root it out. Paula Phelps, the DNR's coldwater fish production supervisor, said the pathogen seemed to be under control for some time but then became wide-spread.

The pathogen is a bacteria found in surface water in concentrations that don't usually cause desease outbreaks. It is believed to have found its way into the hatchery via floodwaters in 2007.

Once the facility is thougherly sanitized and upgraded for maintenance reasons, it will resume the rearing of brook trout using the eggs of native fish. If the facility remains desease-free for three years, stocking will resume, Phelps said. In the meantime, the DNR will pick up the slack in stocking with brook trout raised at national fish hatcheries in Iron River and Genoa, Wis.

"We tried to treat [the desease] and it was under control for some time...but it continued to spread," Phelps said.

The Crystal Springs hatchery, operated by the DNR since 1932, was the only place where the state raised brook trout and lake trout. For years, the lake trout were released into Lake Superior, while the brook trout were released primarily in northeastern and southeastern Minnesota. Phelps said the hatchery won't resume the rearing of lake trout unless the Lake Superior fish management plan -now under review— calls for it.

She also said brown trout and rainbow trout raised in the DNR hatchery in Lanesboro, Minn., will be stocked in certain waters over the next three years to help make up for the shortfall at Crystal Springs.

DNR uses three categories to classify trout streams to ensure adequate protection and proper management. Class 1, Class 2 and Class 3. Class 1 streams, such as a newly upgraded segment of Black Earth Creek in Dane County and newly classified streams in Iron, Pierce and Sauk counties sustain healthy populations of wild trout through natural reproduction and require no stocking. Wisconsin currently holds some 5,289 miles of Class 1 trout streams, about 40 percent of the state's total trout stream mileage

Class 2 waters contain some natural reproduction, but not enough to use available food and space and require stocking to maintain a desirable sport fishery. Trout survive and grow well in these waters, which account for about 6,126 miles or 46 percent of the total trout stream mileage.

Class 3 waters provide marginal habitat with no natural reproduction or carryover of the stocked fish. Wisconsin hols some 1,817 miles of Class 3 trout streams, about 14 percent of the total. Through habitat improvement efforts, some Class 3 streams can sustain natural reproduction and achieve a Class 2 ranking, as with streams in Buffalo and Trempealeau counties over the past two years.

The survey work also leads to a better understanding of trout populations in key waters and played a role in the development of the simplified regulations that will debut during the 2016 regular trout season. The regulations will create more uniformity for anglers who fish on different trout streams and within small geographic areas.

Under the new system, maps online and in the regulation pamphlet will indicate one of three regulations:

- Green means go fish, with no length limit, a bag limit of five fish and no bait restrictions:
- Yellow means caution, with an 8 inch length limit, a bag limit of three fish and no bait restrictions; and
- Red means special regulations are in place. Anglers are advised to stop and understand the regulations before fishing.


