## IL teen catches new state-record walleye



ROCKFORD, IL – The Illinois DNR salutes 15-year-old Nick Tassoni of Rockford for catching a new state-record walleye. The fish was caught on January 7, 2012 on the Pecatonica River between Rockton and Harrison in Winnebago County. Nick Tassoni caught the fish while fishing the river with his father, David Tassoni.

The DNR reports the fish weighed in at 14.12 lb., was 31" long and had with a girth of 20.25". Tssoni's fish topped the previous state-record walleye, a 14 pounder caught on the Kankakee River in 1961.

Nick Tassoni, a freshman at Rockford Auburn High School, reported catching the fish with a Rapala Minnow Rap lure on Berkley Trilene Big Game 10 lb. line, using a Falcon Carolina Lizzard Dragger rod and Ambassadeur 5000 reel.

## Lake Michigan Stocking Conference April 14

The four Lake Michigan DNRs have set the date of April 14 for the next lakewide stocking conference. Similar to the one held on April 9, 2005 this one will also be held in Benton Harbor and the Lake Michigan College.

The agencies have been conducting a series of meetings to review various stocking models developed by Dr. Mike Jones, Director Michigan State's Dept. of Natural Resources.

Some of those models include:

- Do nothing
- Increase stocking levels 10%
- Decrease stocking levels 10%
- Decrease stocking levels 20%

Other variations include: cut only Chinook Salmon, cut Chinooks and Lake Trout, cut all species including Chinooks, Browns, Steelhead and Lake Trout; another variation includes cutting all species except Lake Trout.

These or some variations of these models will be presented to the attendees of the April 14 conference. There will probably be the option to present your own variation.

1/9/12 Holidays are over and there is still no ice to speak of in SE Wisconsin. Last week end, (Jan 7th & 8th) saw boaters still fishing harbor. These die-hards have been doing

quite well with Browns and Rainbows all winter. They usually average 3-5 fish per outing, sometimes more. That may not sound like a lot, but compared to how the shore fishermen have been doing it's a bonanza.

Nothing to tell about the inland lakes. Did hear on the news about a Pleasant Prairie resident who had to be rescued from the pond at Big Oakes Golf Course. Stay off the ice please. This week's temps will average around 30 with Thurs. being the first actual cold day (23). Personally I don't miss the nasty weather, but I'm sure there are those of you who are dying to get out on the ice. Let's wait a while so this statement doesn't become literal. Later, Bob.

1/20/12 As of today, the ice in the harbor is not safe enough to walk on. If you think about it, one week ago it was 55 and sunny. Tues. and Wed. the 10th and 11th found Max and Jerry trolling out by the hill. They started looking for baitfish in about 70ft. of water, didn't find any, but did mark larger fish. They dropped a couple of spoons down to the bottom- what kind I will not disclose- and wound up with several nice Lakers which they released, and a couple of nice Browns. The second day they got more Browns than Lakers. Jerry told me the Lakers were really pale with not much color which started us wondering whether they just lay on the bottom this time of year- basically dormant until something swims past their face. I'm merely illustrating two things with this tale, first- not everybody is brave enough to troll in January and I think this is a great accomplishment, (especially for guys their age) and second- the ice isn't that old. This weekend it may be safe enough, but I'm not recommending it to anyone who calls here. The marina is solid enough for traffic if you want to mess with Northerns. I'm afraid the days of trout being caught in there with any regularity are behind us. Inland lake ice is safe for pedestrians according to all my reports. Be careful- no fish is worth dying for- Bob

2/7/12 Most people I know have written off ice fishing for the year. No one wants to take a chance on marginal ice. I hear the county lakes are still safe, and so is Delavan, but having driven out to the county several times, I have not seen anyone fishing. Here in the harbor the ice is gone and the fishing has been sporadic. Over the weekend there was quite a bit of Brown action. Even a few Rainbows were caught. The ice in the marina is not good either, and I'm glad to see that most people fishing there have been smart enough to stay on the docks when drilling their holes. The #1 bait by far has been tube jigs either fished under a bobber, or jigged above the weeds. Small spoons, and crankbaits have also been producing. Spawn has been a slow contender. Minnows, like roaches, have been on and off depending on the day. Wish I could say more, but that pretty much sums it up. This weekend is Stoneface's Derby. Don't really know what will happen as far as fishing. Knowing that bunch -if nothing else -the party will still go on at the bar. I think most people would have to agree that when it comes to derbies, fishing is the smallest part of them. Later- Bob

## Permanent barriers to stop Asian carp at Chicago feasible

### Cheapest plan \$3 billion and could cost as much as \$11 billion

**Chicago** – Strategies for restoring the natural divide between the Great Lakes and Mississippi River basins to keep Asian carp out of the Great Lakes—and, in the process, modernizing the Chicago Area Waterway System (CAWS)—are identified in a report released by the Great Lakes Commission and the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative.

—Physically separating the Great Lakes and Mississippi River watersheds is the best long-term solution for preventing the movement of Asian carp and other aquatic invasive species, and our report demonstrates that it can be done, said Tim Eder, executive director of the Great Lakes Commission. The threat of Asian carp looms large for communities in the Great Lakes region. The lakes provide over 35 million residents with drinking water, contain 20 percent of the Earth's fresh surface water, and support a thriving tourism industry and world-class fishery, which generates an estimated \$7 billion in economic activity annually.

Voracious feeders that can grow up to 90 pounds, Asian carp have overrun other ecosystems and could cause irreversible damage to the Great Lakes if allowed entry. Once established, invasive species are nearly impossible to eliminate.

The three separation alternatives include a down-river single barrier between the confluence of the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal and the Cal-Sag Channel and the Lockport Lock; a mid-system alternative of four barriers on CAWS branches between Lockport and Lake Michigan; and a near-lake alternative of up to five barriers closest to the lakeshore. All three include measures to improve the CAWS's role in flood management, wastewater treatment and maritime transportation, as well as stopping the interbasin movement of aquatic invasive species.

The three separation alternatives in the report were developed by the engineering firm HDR, Inc., which considered some 20 possible barrier locations in its analysis. No recommended alternative is identified. However, one alternative, the mid-system solution, is the least costly and offers other advantages.

The analysis concludes that preventing just a single invasive species from entering the Great Lakes can save as much as \$5 billion over 30 years. The Corps of Engineers has identified 10 species that are poised to invade the Great Lakes from the Mississippi River.

According to the report's economic analysis, the cost of the barriers themselves is as low as \$109 million. The addition of all improvements to address water quality, flood prevention and transportation brings the cost to between \$3 billion and \$9.5 billion, depending on the location and the degree to which the wastewater treatment plants on the system are improved to meet future Clean Water Act requirements.

The analysis also finds that households in the Great Lakes basin would have to be willing to pay, on average, about \$1 a month from now through 2059 to cover the cost of the mid-system alternative, based on a projected cost of \$4.27 billion. The Initiative points out that the construction costs to build the current CAWS in today's dollars would be \$11 billion.

Asian carp have been migrating up the Mississippi River system since the early 1990s and were detected in 2009 to have breached electronic barriers operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in the CAWS. In 2010 a live Asian carp was captured in Lake Calumet just six miles from Lake Michigan.

The current efforts by the state of Illinois, the Corps of Engineers and others to monitor and slow the carp migration are critical and are buying us time to implement a long-term solution, said Eder. —While we recognize and support the work being done by others to find solutions to the Asian carp threat, we need to appreciate fully the urgency of this matter, Ullrich emphasized.

Ontario and Québec, and the Cities Initiative, a coalition of U.S. and Canadian mayors, embarked on the accelerated study in 2010 believing separation to be the best strategy for preventing the movement of Asian carp and other aquatic invasive species between the two watersheds via the CAWS. The \$2 million project was funded by a collaboration of six regional funders: Joyce Foundation, C.S. Mott Foundation, Great Lakes Fishery Trust, Wege Foundation, Great Lakes Protection Fund and the Frey Foundation.

To provide guidance and input for the project, a bipartisan Executive Committee was established and a diverse Advisory Committee was convened among stakeholders from the Great Lakes region, with an emphasis on interest groups in the Chicago area. In addition, a Resource Group made up of governmental and quasi-governmental entities with a direct interest in the project also participated.
