# Jacks' Flies of the month...

- Jan. 3rd; Norm's Fisherman's Catcher: The KSFCA Fly Tyers are starting out the new year with an incredible fish catching fly that is more than a fly pattern; it's a method for for making a productive fly. The fly is very buggy and two eyes tied forward make this fly very seductive. Come to fly tying and learn it!
- Jan. 10th; Scud Night: In most streams, the scud is a very important part of the trout's diet and is usually the most abundant of all aquatic insects. Scuds come in a variety of colors and are found in the weeds in the Kenosha Harbor! Yes, that close to home.
- <u>Jan. 17th</u>; <u>Murdich Minnow</u>: This fly is tied on a bass hook. This multi-species fly has the appear ance of a silver-pearl minnow and is fished like a streamer. Good luck with it because the fish can't miss it in the water
- <u>Jan. 24th</u>; <u>Little Black Stone</u>: This fly is a good fly to fish during the early catch and release season here in Wisconsin. The best months are March, April and May. This pattern is tied in black and is weighted for bottom bouncing.
- <u>Jan. 31st</u>; <u>Pink Squirrel</u>: John Bethke (Pink Squirrel originator) and Dave Whitlock (red squirrel nymph and noted national fly tyer) both noticed how the red squirrel fur can enhance the nymph patterns; both use red squirrel in their nymph patterns.

A Pink Squirrel is tied on a number #14 scud hook, weighted, using micro sized pink chen nile; easy to tie and deadly in the stream.



Steelhead fishing in the Root River has been good. Most fish are biting on Spawn Sacs or Tube Jigs. Brown trout have been a little tough but some big fish are biting in the harbors on Flickershad. In Northpoint Marina, big pike are biting on XL Shiners and Medium Suckers. There has also been a good crappie bite at night on Silver Lake. The warm weather has made the ice conditions dangerous but cold nights should help to lock it back up.


# **DNR** weighing large dairy project

The state Department of Natural Resources is inching closer to a long-anticipated decision involving the construction of a massive dairy farm that would house more than 5,000 cows in Wood County in central Wisconsin.

The DNR's environmental impact statement on the <u>Golden Sands Dairy</u> — and the decision that would follow — is being closely watched because of the scale of the project and the vulnerability the sandy soil in the region could pose on groundwater.

And it comes as the DNR last Wednesday said it plans to streamline some regulatory functions, including permitting of large farms. Conservationists say they will be monitoring the changes to ensure environmental standards won't be weakened.

Also on Wednesday, in Wood County in the <u>Town of Saratoga</u> where Golden Sands would operate, the town board approved regulations giving it new inspection authority and other powers for livestock and manure storage practices aimed at large farms.




This snowy owl, rescued from a old chimney in Green Bay by a DNR wildlife biologist last winter, was successfully returned to the wild after rehabilitation.


