## Brad Eggold Studies Captivate his Audience

Wisconsin's DNR Lake Michigan Fisheries Supervisor Brad Eggold was our guest speaker in December's meeting. With his slide show presentation he explained how and why stocking numbers are the way they are. Brad put out a lot of information on many topics, I will attempt to share some of each topic.

From facts obtained the past years the DNR believes 50% of the Kings in Michigan are naturally born. Michigan rivers are superior for their reproduction. But not to worry the fish do travel extensively throughout the lake following bait and comfortable temperatures.

From contest's held around the lake tails are sent exclusively to Plainwell, Michigan to obtain "OTC" information. This process averages about \$60,000 a year. With this dye and clippings given to fry (1996 to 2010) it leaves a signature in the spine. With the tails and clipping information, the labs can determine where and when the fish was released. Thus learning the travel and weight gain of the fish or if it was natural.

A few facts given: 2007 wild return in Kenosha was 56%, 2008 54%, 2009 53%, 2010 56%. From a 4 year average 56% were 1 year olds, 67% were 2 years old and 62% were 3 year olds.

In 2011 this side of the lake 1.127 million Kings were released, 433,000 Coho's, in 2011 500,000 Coho will be released. Because Wild Rose hatchery cannot raise inland game fish (VHS concerns). They can raise the numbers of. Coho Kettle Moraine hatchery acquired a disease and lost 30,000 kings last year, so the DNR reduced Racine's Pond by a percentage, thus for a one time deal Racine will get 30,000 more to keep returns high. Do not get upset, reason for this is so when more eggs are collected in Racine it helps us all.

The DNR figures 4 million natural born fish are in Lake Michigan, about what total is released yearly. The DNR has a piece of equipment that can clip and inject 80,000 fry a day. This system, computer operated can give average length and weight.

The DNR also monitors "Angler Hours". Over the last 20 years the hours fished have decreased 2 million hours. Fish returns show 61% are 3 year olds. When fish are 35 inches or more it is difficult to tell if the fish is 2,3 or 4 years old. There are many factors for a year's growth and weight class of each release, forage base, weather temperatures and lake conditions. So when you hear over the radio a boat caught a 4 year old he must have a laboratory on board. Just sayin.

There is talk of Herring being stocked in Lake Michigan, a natural habitat of the lake. Few are caught now. Thus ther is probability of this happening. Also brought up during discussion was White Fish being natural up by Green Bay.

The RV Coregonus, a 60-foot research vessel constructed to support expanded study and survey work of the Lake Michigan fishery. DNR fisheries staff worked closely with Seacraft Design, LLC of Sturgeon Bay to develop the design that would maintain the ability to use gill nets during all but the most extreme sea conditions, while expanding its capabilities for research. Its capabilities include trawling and deploying hydro-acoustic equipment.

The RV Barney Devine had a top speed of less than 10 knots, which meant a travel time from Sturgeon Bay to Milwaukee of 15 to 16 hours. The RV Coregonus will be able to travel 20 knots, decreasing the travel time and increasing efficiency.



## Burger Launches Research Vessel "Coregonus"



Manitowoc, Wisconsin, U.S.A. – April 8, 2011 Burger Boat Company launches the R/V Coregonus, a 60' Research Vessel for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

R/V Coregonus is replacing the R/V Barney Devine, a steel Fishing Tug built by Burger in 1937.

SeaCraft Design in Sturgeon Bay, WI designed the R/V Coregonus for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to meet the demanding requirements of the department. Powered by twin Caterpillar C12 diesel engines, the all welded aluminum R/V Coregonus will provide a cruising speed of 20 knots. An onboard laboratory, gill net fishing equipment, trawl net reel, folding dive platform, crane and hydro-acoustic gear makes the R/V Coregonus a versatile research vessel that can be used in all but the most extreme sea conditions. In addition, the pilot-house windshield and open aft deck are heated to prevent icing during winter operations.

Ingredients:


- 4 oz. salmon filets







## Wisconsin Salmon Stamp Report Available On-Line

Anglers enjoying Great Lakes fishing for trout and salmon can see how their purchase of trout and salmon stamps is improving their sport. The Salmon Stamp report for Fiscal Years 2006-2011 is now available online. DNR's Great Lakes trout and salmon program is supported entirely by anglers and hunters and half of that — about \$1.8 million — comes from the sale of salmon stamps and two-day Great Lakes fishing licenses. The rest of the funding comes from fishing licenses and other contributed to the segregated Fish and Wildlife Account. Wisconsin started stocking Pacific strain trout and salmon in the 1960s to help control alewives. While Wisconsin waters don't support natural reproduction because of higher water temperatures and other factors, Michigan's do. In the early 1980s, the loss of federal funding for non-native trout and salmon stocking prompted the creation of Wisconsin's Great Lakes Trout and Salmon Stamp Program to raise money to allow continued rearing and stocking. Since 1982, every angler fishing for salmon or trout in the Wisconsin waters of the Great Lakes has been required to purchase a Great Lakes Trout and Salmon Stamp in addition to a fishing license.
