For those of you who actually read this, and how many of you there are I have no idea, I should mention the following specials. First of all, I'm trying to get rid of the last of the FISHLANDERS to make room for more colors of Moonshines, Dreamweavers, and Stingers. FISHLANDER was always a great fish killing spoon. Their extended glows were really hot a few years ago. The company went under, news got out, and all of a sudden no one was interested anymore. It doesn't mean they still don't produce lots of fish. That's how it is in the spoon world. You're hot until the next guy comes along. HOWEVER, I'm offering them at a "steal". Regular size- all colors and finishes regularly \$4.59 to \$6.89 now \$3.00 ea., or 4 for \$10.00. Magnums- all colors and finishes regularly \$5.39 to \$7.29 now \$5.00 ea. or 4 for \$12.00. Got it? \$29.16 worth of spoons for 12 bucks. You won't find that anywhere.

Presently I'm also having a sale on LUCKYCRAFT cranks. Not that they aren't great, but I want to generate more interest in them. So the ones in the \$16.50 to \$18.00 range are now 3 for \$45.00. Additionally, I'm totally liquidating my stock of LIVE TARGET cranks. The guy had the audacity to tell me that I was selling them for less than his suggested retail, so you know what he can do. Regularly \$11.79 (already cheap) now 3 for \$25.00.

Now that the business is over- let's talk fishing. Saturday the 29th I was planning on going out on the big lake- although as you already know I don't relish putting the riggers on, checking my flares, making sure my radio works, finding a compass, and all the other rigmarole that comes with trolling. Then Gehrke came in here on Friday and started talking trash. "You should take your wife out to upper twin!" "I was just out there yesterday and we slaughtered the big gills." "Is that so?", I said. "Yeah, we got our 75 in no time. I was done by 9:30. They were huge. I'm taking my wife out there tomorrow. You should take yours out there. There were beds all over the west end in about 8ft of water. And you should bring your bow because there were huge carp cruising all over the place." As if the possibility of getting big gills wasn't enough, he threw in the clincher with the carp. Whacking carp with a fish arrow is about my favorite thing in the world. Well let's say it's way up there on the list anyway.

So I changed my plans, Gale always enjoys bluegill action, so we went. We left at 5 a.m. We invited Brandon (the kid who occasionally fishes with me) and his girl, but Brandon has trouble making the morning bell. I think it's called Jim Beam. Anyway, Gale and I have no problem with being out there by ourselves, so we split. I wait for no one. Neither does Dave. Neither does Bezotte, or any other old timer that takes fishing seriously.

It was a beautiful morning. Half way out there I remembered that I left my bow in the shed. On the way to the lake Gale saw several turkeys, some coyotes, and other assorted wildlife. I've always tried to show her that fishing isn't just about catching fish. After launching, we putted over to the west end of the lake, although I had been marking 8ft. most of the way from the launch to the west. Eight feet was the magic zone where you could no longer see the bottom. As we tooted along I asked Gale to get out the rods. Here's where I start to grin when I think about how proud I am of her fishing skills and knowledge. She immediately got out only the ultra-lights. She asked me if I was going to use only one rod, or two. I said, "probably two." She saw me tying on a small bobber over an ice jig and she said, "who are you rigging that for?" I said, "for you." She said, "I'm not using a bobber!", as if I was an idiot. I said, "oh." She picked through the rest of the rods and found one that had only one of Dave's worms tied on it because the other had broken off. "This one will do just fine", she huffed. She got up on the back deck, casted it out and started snap jigging it back to the boat. From then on it was bam, bam, bam, as she caught fish after fish. Bluegills, and pumpkinseeds, and bass, and crappies, she caught a 14+ in. walleye, and even caught a warmouth, which I haven't seen one of since I was a kid. I was catching fish too with my bobber/ice jig. What? Did you think I was going to take it off? I tied into a nice 3lb. football shaped carp that took about ten minutes to land, lots of gills but nothing she, or I would consider keeping. Never saw Gehrke, or many other people for that matter. Probably because he was embarrassed at the actual size of the gills. (I'm guessing). By 8:30 the action slowed some, we had caught plenty of fish so by 8:45 we were heading back to the launch. Boat was on at 9:00 and by 9:15 we were sitting in Manny's Snack Shack on the east end of town/ lake ordering breakfast, which by the way was huge and good. Neither of us could have asked for a better morning.

Cohos- 120 was the best depth so far for the weekend. Many guys are already pulling magnum spoons because most boats are tangling with one or two Kings in the 15lb. range, so I guess the peanut fly small red doger bite is over. Sounds like most guys are using everything from leadcore to riggers. I'd imagine the small boat guys without riggers will not be doing as well.

Colors? Dreamweaver's thriller if you happen to have one- of course I got cleaned out. Otherwise I heard purple (Kevorkian). That's enough for now, Bob.

### Experiment to Your Advantage

Ever wonder why it is that some seem to consistently catch fish while you struggle to catch a few? The advantage of you being with the KSFC is your access to years of experience, and being in Kenosha! If the opportunity arises go on other boats and observe different techniques, they all have their own.

The SWR (secret weapon rig) a 2 or 3 color lead used on a downrigger is still used and productful. New techniques come up. Such as copper on a bird. Yes it does work, another line deep, and away from the boat.

But a ten or five color lead with a 1 ounce weight or even more can suffice. Having a high retrieve helps. As the sun rises running more birds will enhance your cooler. Something I have learned is do not be afraid to experiment, be patient, you do not have to break the bank.

My first few years with lead were, let's say "trying". I have caught myself more than once with lead core all over my back yard untangling. Once you learn to be careful letting it out between other lines, longer line inside of shorter lines you will be safe. I have seen more than one boat loose a copper line. Keep good knots and be aware of the bird's release you use.

There are many types of lines used, do not be afraid to talk to members. All fishermen have stories and love to tell them. Many a preferences out there, the more information the better. Good Luck and catch a few more!

# KSFCA Contest Rules

## Monthly Contest

Angler must be a regular member of the Kenosha Sports Fishing and Conservation Association.

Angler must have joined the Association at least two days prior to entering a fish in any KSFCA sanctioned contest. Unless clearly specified otherwise.

All fish must be caught in Lake Michigan (as defined in DNR regulations)

Controversy shall be settled by the Contest Committee. The committee will act on any protest, filed in writing, by any KSFCA member and given to any member of the Contest committee. But will provide interpretations to a rule or controversy as information to the member. Resolution of a controversy is the decision of the Contest Committee, whose decision will be final.

All fish registered for Any KSFCA contest must be a minimum of 16" in length. All fish must be registered at Harborside Bait and Tackle. Monthly contest starts first of May and ends in September's end. Each month is a new month. Fish must be registered that month.

A fish may be held overnight for weigh-in the next day, provided that following day is in the same month.

Awards for the top three fish of each species will be awarded on the next month's meeting.

Points are awarded for the top three fish. Which is totaled at the end of the year and at that time, points are tabulated.

First = 5 points    Second = 3 points    Third = 2 points  
 \$20.00            \$15.00            \$10.00

Based on points, the winner receives the Phil Sanders Master Angler Award.

**Rules may be changed once the contest committee has deemed necessary.**

## Monthly Outing Rules

- **5:30 A.M.** Start, entrants may call in no later than 6:00 A.M. over the marine radio on **channel 8**. 1/2 hr. start run time allowed.
- Members and non members must register at **Harborside Bait & Tackle Shop**.
- Contestants may use up to 9 rods per boat.
- Weigh in will be at **11.00 A.M.** at the fish cleaning station.
- Non member fee's will be \$30.00 and will include a membership for the remainder of the year. \$5.00 for Big Fish.
- Member's fee will be \$20.00 and \$5.00 for Big Fish.
- Total weight of 10 fish will be used to place.
- All Wisconsin regulations apply. Any citations issued by the Coast Guard or DNR will cause automatic disqualification.
- Prizes to be awarded at the KSFCA monthly meeting at the Moose Club.
- The club uses Marine channel 8.



## WI - Walleye bag limits to increase on 369 northern lakes

(article from the Great Lakes Basin Report)

MADISON – Daily walleye bag limits increased May 21 on 369 lakes in the Wisconsin Ceded Territory to reflect spring spearing harvest by six Wisconsin bands of Chippewa Indians.

A daily bag limit of two walleye will increase to three walleye per day on 83 lakes. In addition, 286 lakes will go from an initial bag limit of two or three walleyes per day to the state daily bag limit of five, according to Joe Hennessy, who coordinates the treaty fisheries management program for the Department of Natural Resources.

Anglers should consult the 2010-11 "Guide to Wisconsin Hook and Line Fishing Regulations," signs at boat landings, and the 2010-2011 Revised Ceded Territory Walleye Bag Limits pamphlet for lake-specific information.

As part of a 1983 Federal Appellate Court decision affirming Chippewa off-reservation hunting, fishing, and gathering rights, the six bands of Wisconsin Chippewa set annual harvest quotas for off-reservation lakes in the Wisconsin Ceded Territory. To assure the combined tribal and recreational angler harvest does not exceed a sustainable level, the state sets recreational bag limits in lakes declared for harvest by the Chippewa bands.

An administrative rule passed by the state Natural Resources Board in 1998 allows the department to adjust initial bag limits annually to reflect actual spring spearing harvests and projected summer harvests.

Of the 243 lakes with bag limits less than five, 83 lakes will have a bag limit of two walleye per day, and 160 lakes will have a daily bag of three walleye per day. The six Chippewa tribes together harvested 34,157 as of May 15, 2010.
